THE OPENING ORGAN VOLUNTARY TODAY is a partita on the 16th century German chorale *Herzlich lieb*, "Lord, You I love with all my heart", by Gerhard Krapf. A native of Germany, Krapf taught at the University of Alberta in Edmonton and then for many years was professor of music and chairman of the organ department at the University of Iowa. He wrote much music for the church, with his goal being "to enliven church music". To this end his compositions tend to be marked by intense but varied rhythms, an emphasis on articulation of voices, sometimes abrupt changes in mood or style, and harmonies which range from austere and edgy to dissonant to glorious cadence resolutions. The partita begins with a quiet statement of the chorale. Part two is a canzonetta, a spritely song, in which the melody of the chorale is passed back and forth between the right and left hands, soprano and tenor voices. Part three is a meditation in which the melody in the right hand is very highly ornamented. The postlude is by the late great Canadian Healey Willan based on the tune of the recessional hymn.

APRIL'S COLLECTION IS PERSONAL CARE ITEMS for those who use the Damiano Center. Thanks to all who have helped us fill out baskets twice already this month. Next Sunday will be the last Sunday to bring your personal hygiene items. Personal hygiene items such as soap, shampoo, toothpaste, toothbrushes and deodorant are distributed by the social workers at Damiano to those who eat in the Soup Kitchen. Eliminating chronic hunger is at the heart of the Damiano Center Soup Kitchen, which is an on-site meal program serving twelve meals each week. They are part of the local Hunger Coalition that coordinates a serving schedule and other meal programs so that a free meal is available three times a day, seven days a week, to the hungry and malnourished in Duluth. In 2005, the Soup Kitchen served 92,969 meals and used 118,958 pounds of salvaged food in meal preparation.

NEWS FROM THE CHILDRENS' LIBRARY: We have several new books in our library. The books are about global warming, climate change and how we can help our earth. These books are just in time for Earth Day, April 22, 2008. We welcome our Sunday School teachers to use our books as well.
